Introduction

Local Care Networks (LCNs) bring together different providers and communities across a local area to improve the health and wellbeing of local people. Their core aims are to share responsibility for maximizing wellbeing, working together and delivering value care.

Development work to date has been driven through a structure of 3 Local Care Network Boards and 3 Local Care Network Forums. The LCNs have achieved good progress with testing a model of care co-ordination, reviewing this and planning a revised version. The Forums, with their semi open membership, have allowed people and local services to meet each other and find out about activities, support and services in their neighbourhood.

The LCNs are now exploring two further areas of work: Neighbourhood Based Care (NBC) and Health and Wellbeing Networks (HWBN).



Neighbourhood Based Care & Health and Wellbeing Networks

Neighbourhood Based Care

- Propose to establish 9-12 neighbourhoods around Lambeth's town centres with a population of 30-50,000
- Number of services to be delivered in these neighbourhoods, such as:
 - Neighbourhood Nursing
 - GP Clusters
 - Community/Domiciliary Care
- Other borough based services to interface with these neighbourhood based services

Health and Wellbeing Networks

- Neighbourhood Based Care services to operate within a broader Health and Wellbeing Network, which connects a broad range of community assets, such as:
 - Voluntary sector services and groups
 - Other statutory services, such as housing, schools, local police
 - Community groups, clubs, initiatives
 - Etc.

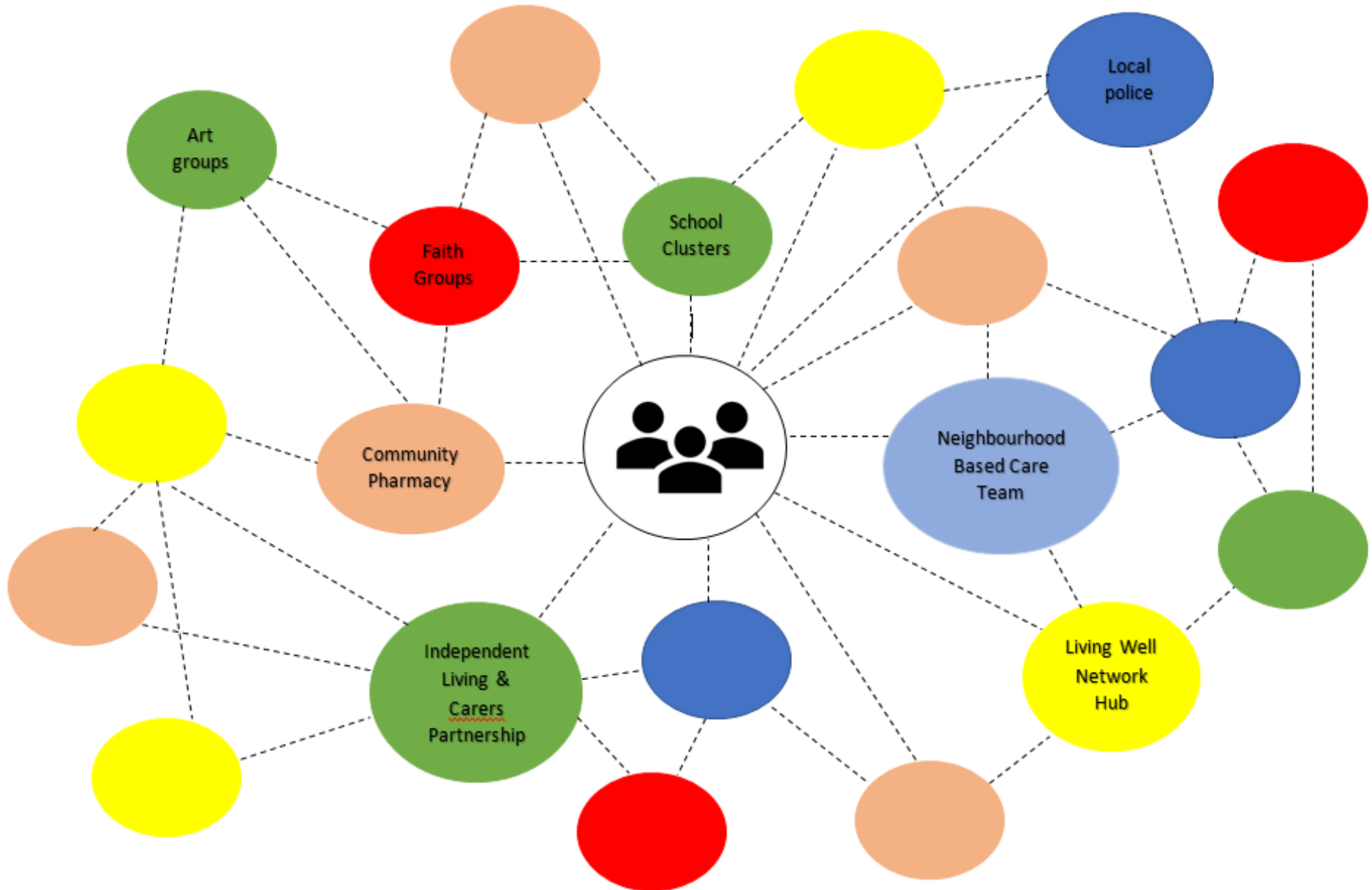

Health and Wellbeing Network Functions

Health and Wellbeing Networks workstream proposed a number of functions for a network:

1. Support community assets to **thrive and develop**
2. **Facilitate connections between community assets** so that they work better as a network
3. **Facilitate connections of people to assets**, so that people are informed and able to choose the activity/support they want

However, need more clarity on what we mean by a network and how best to support its development.

Co-production Process to Scope Health and Wellbeing Networks

When we design services, we:

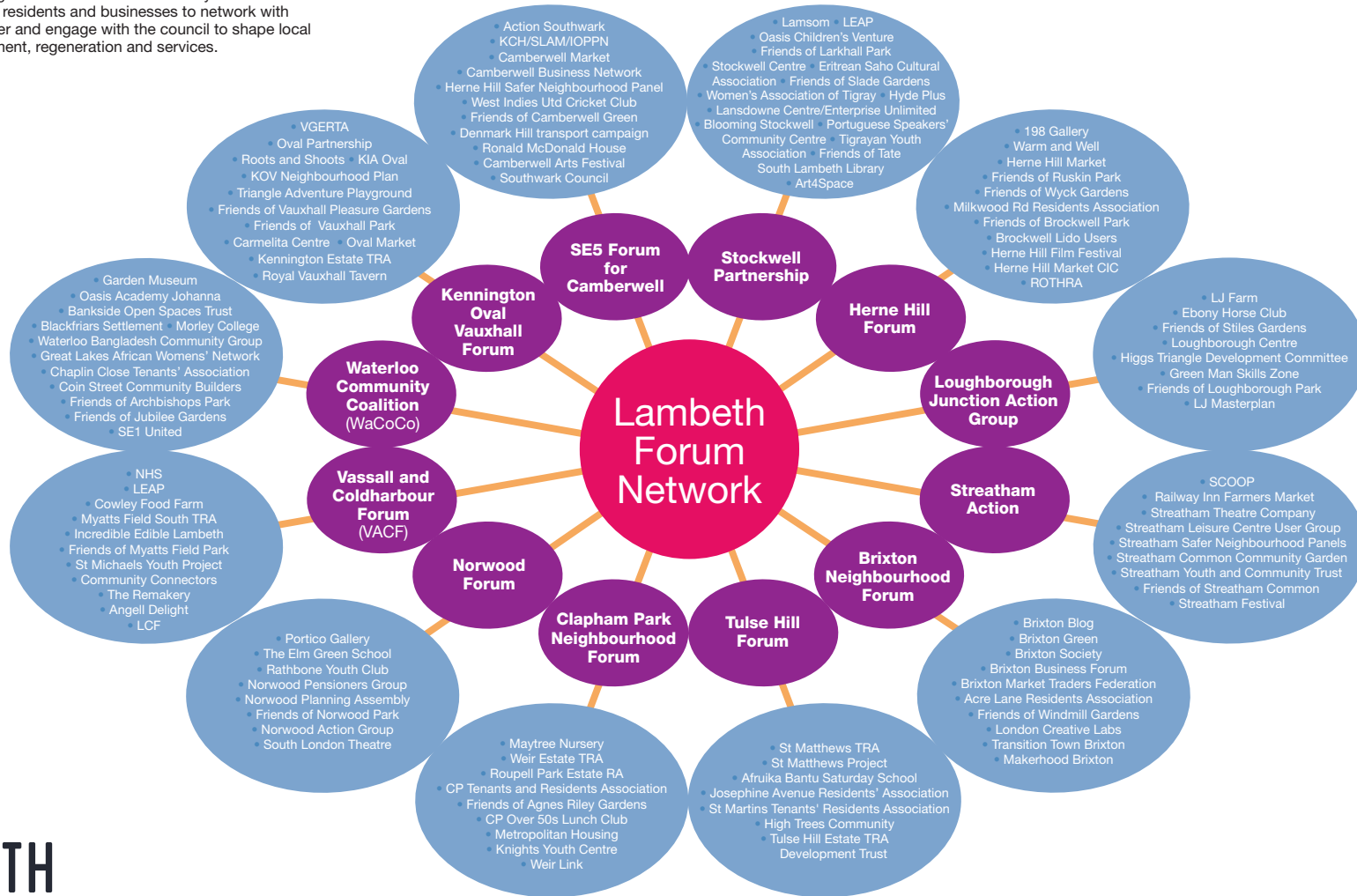
- Involve people who use those services (or may use them) and their families as well as those who work in services, from the outset
- Are open and honest and share our realities, to build shared understanding, ownership and collective responsibility for what we are doing
- Have joint commitment to sharing power and decisions with citizens
- Don't use jargon or acronyms
- Recognise that everyone has a unique contribution; we listen and respect all perspectives
- Are innovative and rapidly test, learn and share



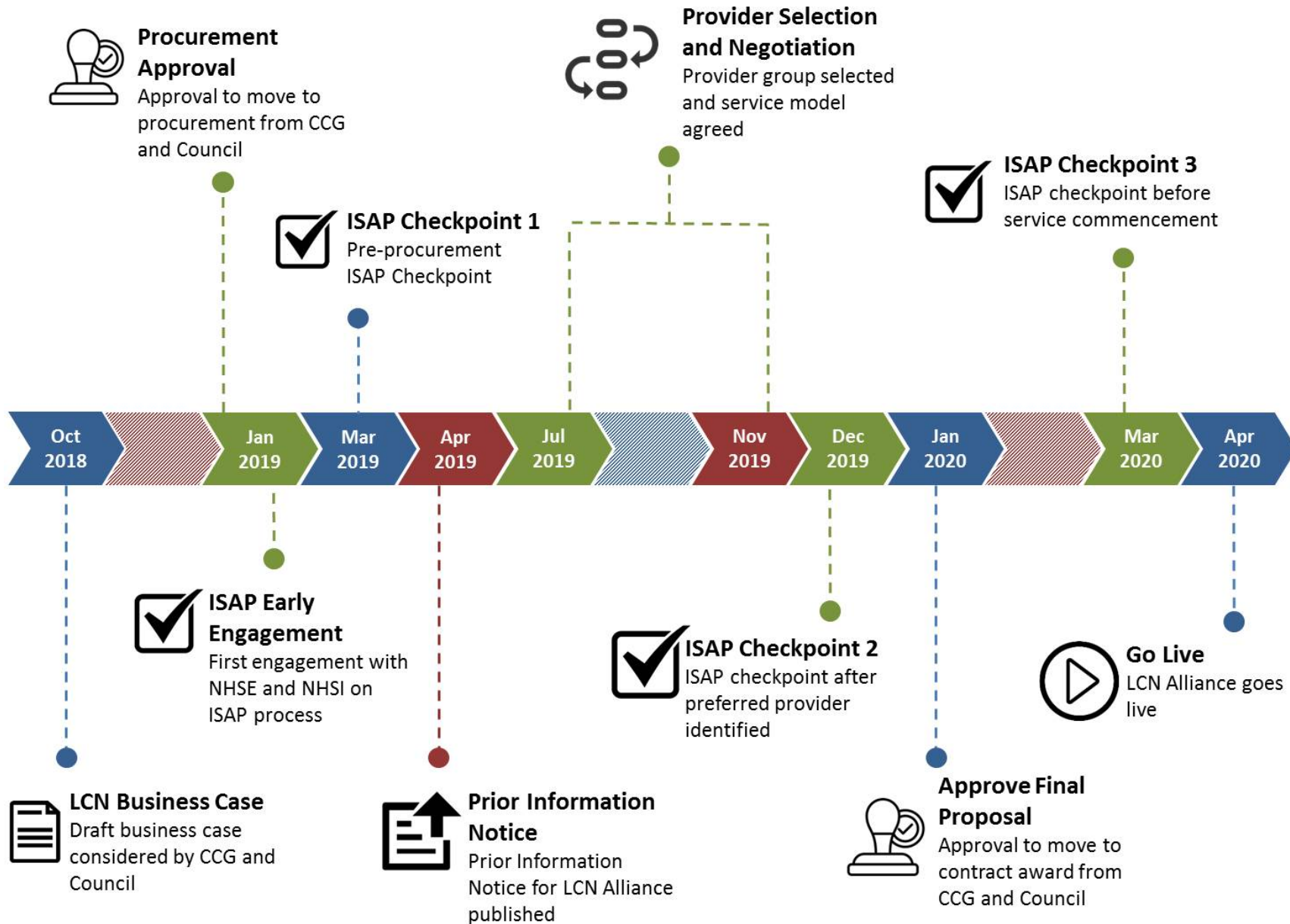
What Role Could Forums play?
